

Buoys This year there were more applications than in the past few years for buoys. All applicants received their first choice in the buoy lottery, but there are a few remaining who did not get their second choice. We have an active waiting list that is maintained in the business office. If a member contacts me to give up a minimum of one week or more and I am able to accommodate someone on the wait list, a refund will be granted minus an administrative fee of \$25.00.

Pier attendants are available weekends only until June 15th, and full-time thereafter until the end of the summer. This service is weather permitting. The first session has begun. Please be sure to move your boat off the assigned buoy by 12 Noon on Sunday, 7/22/12 to accommodate the next member assigned to that buoy. The second session begins at 12 Noon on Monday, 7/23/12 and you must be off your buoy no later than Monday, 10/1/12. Weekly assignments are from Monday - Sunday.

Several members tend to leave their boat registrations in their boats in storage for the winter. Please remember to make a copy and keep it at your home at all times. It is required each year with the buoy lottery application in addition to confirmation of current boat insurance. **Beach Rack Storage** This year we had a record request for rack storage spaces. We are almost at full storage capacity. As always, we try to suit everybody's needs. Please use the space assigned to you and ask for help if you need it. Everyone would like a lower storage space, but we cannot accommodate everybody. Please be respectful of other member's boats. If you notice any misuse of the racks or see any vandalism please report it immediately to the staff on duty or call the business office at 583-4487.

Paddleboards have grown in popularity and are now being stored on the kayak racks. We are working to find better ways to suit that community for storage on the DPA beach. A different system may be in place next year for paddleboard storage. However, at this time only one watercraft per rack space is allowed. Do NOT place your paddleboard on top of your kayak in the same storage space. That is not allowed. It must be paid for separately and stored in its own rack space. Audits will take place regularly throughout the summer. If any watercraft is left unattended on the beach it will be tagged and removed from the beach if not claimed in a timely manner.

PoolPROJECTS

There are several major expenditures at the pool for this year:

A new liquid chlorine system is being installed and this requires that we construct a new secure equipment and chemical equipment storage room within the existing mechanical room of the pool building. The new system is expected to improve the accuracy in the application of our pool chemicals and reduce the downtime for the pool during our months of operation.

The concrete around the pool has become uneven at several points. Trees that were a source of the problem were removed last year, but removal of the uneven areas and pouring new slabs has had to wait until this May.

The ladder railings are being replaced to make them more secure.

The winter pool cover which is many years old is also due to be replaced before the pool is winterized. This cover is the one that helps protect our pool during the winter months. The old cover has a number of tears and the anchors all need to be replaced.

As you will understand none of this happens for free, but the Board is committed to maintaining your facilities to a high standard.
