It is time for the Annual Dollar Point Battery Change-out! Please make sure you swap out your home's smoke detector batteries AND make sure you have your carbon monoxide detectors in place with new batteries, too! No easier way to save lives!

# My Tree is Dead & Needs to be Removed! Now What?

- Entirely dead trees, with no green needles, can be taken down without a permit. Please contact a Tree Service Provider of your choice.
- Trees over 14-inches in diameter at breast height (DBH) require a permit to be removed, unless entirely dead. The tree in question will be marked by either Fire District or TRPA Personnel and a permit will be issued. Under 14-inches DBH means that no permit is needed/required.
- <u>TRPA-approved Tree Service Companies</u> are listed on the Dollar Point website, under the <u>Fire Awareness page</u>.
