



 The boat boys need to stop ferrying ppl to private buoys! Last weekend they delivered someone to her boat that was on OUR buoy. We had noticed the strange boat there and were trying to figure out whose boat it was when the boat boy delivered a woman there. After the boat boy left her on her boat on OUR buoy we went out there on our dinghy to tell her to leave. She insisted that she had paid for the buoy!!! We kept telling her it was our private buoy that went with OUR home and she kept fighting us and telling us that someone had rented her our buoy for the summer. It was getting dark and we told her she had to leave. She said she was going to leave her boat there and swim back to the dollar pt pier. We finally got her to leave on her boat and we noticed she just moved her boat only a few houses down and stole someone else's buoy. Wonder how long it took them to notice. Please please have a talk with the boat boys about this bad practice of ferrying ppl to private buoys. The rules say that they can only deliver to the Dollar Pt buoy field. I think they like the big tips they get but it's not ok.

- We sold our boat, but we always felt the buoy and kayak/paddle board fees were so inexpensive. The kayak and paddle boards have taken up too much of the beach. The buoys have a fee or did if I am correct to TRPA and maintenance costs. To be fair to all owners, the fees should cover any expenses and bring in some revenue to the association.
- I have to have a buoy at TC for full season because one month leaves me half the season stuck launching the boat every day.
- The buoy owners get the best service of the entire community. Why can't the staff help people bring down their items, including paddle boards and kayaks?

- Would love more yoga opportunities
- Personally I don't mind going to A Sante in Tahoe City, but I would be happy to support it. I love the idea of an indoor space for community members to stay active when the weather is bad (per below). But it would be great if there was a section for kids to play like an indoor basketball court.
- As a member, we would support this. But would prefer a clubhouse that can be a member gathering area that would serve a larger cross-section of members (not just the gym enthusiasts). This could be a place for member socials, have games that could be checked out, maybe even have a bar that could be staffed periodically by staff and sell cocktails.
- Yes, a full gym (with weights, cardio machines, etc) would be very useful. Could be a part of a clubhouse/new facility in the vacant lots across from the beach.

Full Gym With weight machines (18 mentions)

- Dumbbells (5 to 75 lbs), 2 adjustable benches, 1 adjustable pulley unit (ideally with 2 pulleys), 1 squat rack (with pull up bar), mirrors, 1 chest press rack, 3-5 yoga mats, 1 bike, 1 treadmill, 2 straight bars (one for bench, one for squat rack), plate weights (small assortment from 5-45 lbs), water dispenser.
- That would be fantastic. Weights and resistance training machines would be my preference. I assume this would be at the pool complex?
- Yes! This would be an amazing addition. Weight training equipment especially
- Absolutely. Love it. Basic workout machines that cover multiple areas of body.
- Yes if additional income can be generated can cover the cost and operation of the gym. Free weights, squat rack, cables, and cardio equipment.
- Yes. Weight lifting equipment
- Yes. Strength training equipment and cardio equipment (treadmills, etc..)
- Only if it would be accessible in winter months. Treadmills, stationary bikes and a basic leg press, bench press and lat pull machine.
- Yes. Treadmills, arm and leg machines, step machine, stationary bicycles
- Yes! Elliptical, stationary bikes, weight machines.
- Workout room with exercise equipment would be great
- Yes, with weights and resistance machines. No cardio machines needed.
- Yes! Free weights and maybe a pulley system, maybe machines. Equipment for resistance training.
- Yes. Year-round access would be important. Combination of cardio and strength equipment would be nice.

- Yea definitely. Some cable weight systems and free weights would be useful.
- Yes, but lower priority than pool area improvements. A basic fitness facility with some cardio machines, weight machines and dumbbells would be nice. But again, lower priority than the pool improvements and additional buoys.
- Yes, cardio options and multifunction nautilus type machines, dumbells up to 50lbs
- Yes, peloton bikes, weight machines, treadmills.

Miscellaneous (6 mentions)

- Additional park at the beach/tennis court area in vacant lot owned by DPA. This could include summer and winter facilities such as a gym, deck, reading area and additional open space useful to the membership.
- 100%. I've seen many developments that have this and am sure there are some consultants on the subject. Done correctly it could materially improve home values as it could be a year round amenity. I'd suggest a multipurpose room (stretching, yoga, etc.), rowing machine (great cross training, most ppl ride bikes outside here), and a free weight set up akin to what you'd find in a gym. Treadmills are great but they do depreciate quick and can have liability issues. I'd be in favor of them. I don't think changing rooms or showers are really necessary given the character of the neighborhood.
- I would propose a par course on the lot that we own by the beach
- This facility would be expensive to build and maintain. Before even considering it, this needs a business model to project income against expense.
- A dry Sauna would also be a nice addition.

- Would love an actually sandy beach like at Sand Harbor feels like a real beach there.
- New lounges and chairs for beach area. More of them
- Add gas to the BBQ's by the beach so they can be used in a fire safe way.
- Gas lines to grills at the beach.
- adjustments to the ramp from gate to pier to allow for disabled access its very steep and scary (can we redesign it to reduce the slope?),
- Dog access is something many owners want (I am sure its a hot topic but important to acknowledge),
- Accessibility to beach for wheelchairs there options for ramps over sand. Moving some rocks and providing a sandy walk out from the beach to deep water when the lake level is low would really help recreation (Its hard dragging a board across the sharp rocks at low tide).
- At the beach, add a water bottle filler, and a real foot washing and shower, like the ones at beaches. Cold water is fine.
- At the beach, perhaps something like a Mobi-mat would help with mobility for people along the deep sand and up to the bathrooms. We do not

currently have anyone in our family with a disability, but certainly the hill, beach and restrooms are not easy to navigate.

Traffic Management (12 mentions)

• Too many errant and speeding drivers

- Not necessarily a member experience issue, but it would be great to get more support for slower traffic throughout the whole development. We constantly see people speeding on Observation and blowing through stop signs pretty much throughout. Very unsafe with people coming out of the pool and tennis courts.
- The association should lobby for a stop sign at Mammoth and Observation Drive near the pool. The three way intersection is dangerous and kids often run out of parking area in front of pool. People also accelerate upon turning onto observation. I know it's a county issue but one the association could advocate for.
- Invest in a large electric golf cart to vallet homeowners to the beach during busy weekends vs investing in more parking.
- Shuttle service to beach
- A cart to transport elderly people to & from beach area
- Shuttle service to the beach area during peak summer weekends from DP residences to reduce parking issues. Consider purchasing a large electric golf cart for this purpose.
- Adding a summer neighborhood shuttle to the beach. Could run every 30 mins. Will help with parking and be a wonderful membership benefit. This seems like a relatively easy solution that would also address parking challenges. Could be paid for by DPA or by members that would use it.
- Invest a small amount of time and resources to get the county to put a 4 way stop sign in at Dollar Drive and Observation. That intersection is a death trap for pedestrians and kids biking. Renters and other visitors fly in off the highway, continuing at 45 mph even if they make a turn.
- More speed bumps to slow traffic
- better speed control
- Next, parking optimization: striping the "drop-off" area and using the "unused" lot for a one way quarter circle (around the big rock, not to turn the empty lot into a parking lot, but to allow one way driving to support a few extra parking spots and to make turnarounds flow safely and efficiently. This would be a safety enhancement as all the folks turning around often do not see the beachgoing pedestrians.

Kayak / Paddle Boards (13 mentions)

Make the beach area nice for both beach goers and kayakers/SUPs. Give them easy access possibly on the right side of the path/dock so easy access to water. Maybe have dock workers also help SUP and Kayakers. Not sure best answer but I think it is becoming a problem.
- More small individual picnic spots at the beach (like tahoe park beach) would be great.
- A shaded area for paddleboard storage (boards get ruined by UV)
- We appreciate all of the kayak and paddle board storage, but do see how it takes up prime beach space. If creating space near the picnic tables is feasible, it would be great to open up beach space for the crowded days.
- Add paddleboard racks and work win to TRPA to allow year-round paddleboard storage (note: north shore condos, skylandia and (I believe) Chinquapin all allow year round storage, with north shore condos and chinquapin visible from the lake.

area for member use should have a balance but with an emphasis on member beach use rather than watercraft storage. In that light, I think putting the racks behind the picnic are invites unnecessary disruption to members using the picnic area by members retrieving their devices. (d) Is the "Electric vehicle for disabled access" for a DPA vehicle such as a golf cart to transport members to the beach area from/to the parking area? If so, and if a DPA staff would drive it, then I would support that if liability concerns are properly addressed.. I would not support using such a vehicle on the county streets due to liability concerns.

- Unless you are being pushed by some gov't agency spending significant money on ada facilities should not be high on the list. It would seem that a simple solution would be to purchase a small golf cart if required to get people up and down the steep hill at the beach. - I believe as long as the Board makes everything very transparent to DPA members and results of surveys are provided to all, so we can see that this is an actual democratic process and things are being done that the majority of members agree upon, then improvements are a good idea.
- There should be a board member (maybe there is), who is the main lead for capital projects. I also think there could be some capital campaigns (fundraising) for some of these projects that would help them get funded faster. Things that members really care about. We should seize on the opportunity of having new members with that may be interested in funding improvements.
- The Lake is the main draw for owners and visitors alike. Increasing the recreational value and making it more accessible will benefit all. We

understand the TRPA can be difficult on some of these topics but recreational value and access are two of their highest priorities - so lets engage in a discussion about how to improve... We have a similar situation with California Coastal Commission in Santa Cruz and have found that earnest engagement with these powerful regulatory bodies can yield progress everyone can agree to...

- Not sure how you manage capital now but we need to maintain the quality of what we have first and secondly continue to improve our DPA facilities with workout facilities that are open year round, more chairs and umbrellas at the beach and additional buoys (if possible).
- I'm not sure how they are managed now so I cannot provide an answer
- Commit to one or two significant projects a year. In order to remain a premier community on Lake Tahoe, we need to be bold and aggressive.
- Possibly a new committee for special projects like what I described above

Tennis Courts (5 mentions)

- I think tennis has declined massively in terms of participation and in living here full time for 3 years now have never seen all 5 courts occupied at same time. This might be useful in terms of thinking about space long term.
- I like the current pickleball arrangement with tennis at the pool area and feel that the DPA is providing the services our family enjoys. Thanks.
- Need a permanent pickle-ball installation!
- Ability to run tournaments for pickleball / tennis.
- As a family, we enjoy the tennis and pickle ball lessons and round robin events. We also enjoy playing bocce ball.

Underground Utilities (3 mentions)

- Underground telephone lines
- Focus on getting a proposal with all possible TRPA/Government Grant support for grounding power lines in Dollar Point street by street approach has not been effective in the past
- Any assistance in helping certain streets have the powerlines undergrounded would be fantastic.

DPA Facility Access (3 mentions)

• Make use equally available per house. If there is too much use, limit use equally among houses. DPA membership is tied to houses, not people. Those people who live or spend the summer in Tahoe should not receive the special treatment they are now receiving.

- I am all about finding an amicable solution for homeowners and renters to be able to access the lake. I get crowds can be thick on summer weekends but mostly the beach is underutilized. My suggestion would be to permit renters to use the pool and beach on 4-5 weekdays per week. It is such a shame to have this gem of a beach cut off from users. It just means they have to get in their cars and drive to another beach. Traffic is already terrible and making it so that people have to drive to somewhere to go to the beach adds to our traffic nightmare.
- Please continue to restrict access for short term vacationers. There are plenty other places to go -- Skylandia, Bristlecone Beach, Carnelian Bay, Tahoe City Commons.

Gym (4 mentions)

- Additional facilities like a gym is more of a nice-to-have, with a trade-off against cost
- Agree a gym could be a valuable addition.
- Adding a workout facility would be a good idea.
- I do think a gym would be great, it wouldn't need to be large, but would need to be carefully planned.

DPA Entrance (3 mentions)

- Needed maintenance on Dollar Drive entrance
- Front Entrance
- I think capital dollars has been spent well at the pool and beach. As I mentioned earlier I think the entrance signage is where focus needs to be.

Pool Area (2 mentions)

- a bocce ball court?
- add children's pool

Snack Shack (1 mention)

• And a snack shack at pool and beach would be amazing!!

Buoys (1 mention)

 I was very disappointed to once again not receive full spring/summer buoy. I think the lottery system should give priority to those who regularly use their boats. If that is too difficult to administer, special priority should be given to full-time HOA members. It's very frustrating that the vast majority of boats are rarely used. Outdoor Furniture (1 mention)

• Upgrades to lounge chairs and other outdoor furniture would be nice at some point;

Pier (1 mention)

• Fix items as the start to fail and not wait until it's completely broke, like several items with the pier

Trees (1 mention)

• Have trees trimmed for better views and remove all dead and beetle infested trees would be my priority

Traffic Management (1 mention)

• Invest a small amount of time and resources to get the county to put a 4 way stop sign in at Dollar Drive and Observation. That intersection is a death trap for pedestrians and kids biking. Renters and other visitors fly in off the highway, continuing at 45 mph even if they make a turn.
