



DOLLAR POINT COMMITTEE NEWSLETTER August 2023

Here in the greater Dollar Point Community, we've likely been spared the many devastating and destructive wildfires we have seen in recent years. Still, we only need to look at the horrific video news clips and images coming out of Lahaina, Maui's inferno this month - exactly as Paradise, CA was turned to ashes and rubble in 2018 - to be reminded of the chaos, death, destruction, displacement, and trauma these fire bring. Lahaina's death count has recently surpassed the 85 souls killed in the Camp Fire, becoming the deadliest fire in the United States in recent history.

Recently, <u>CalMatters</u> debuted a new way to track major wildfires in California—an innovative dashboard that boasts an up-to-date map presentation that combines state and federal information, exploring the current and historical context of wildfires and much more. The dashboard was produced by CalMatters' data and interactives editor John Osborn D'Agostino and data journalist Jeremia Kimelman and features:

California's wildfire history is where one can observe more than a century of our state's wildfires with an animated map. Starting from 1900, you can see where fires often originate and the increasing frequency of wildfires in recent decades. Half of California's 20 deadliest wildfires have occurred in the past two decades, and their intensity is exacerbated by our increasing climate change.

The toll of wildfires covers not only the lives and acreage lost but also presents data on wildfire "dollar damage" or the property and contents damaged by fire and smoke. Visitor users will learn what year wildfires caused \$12.1 billion in damage—the largest amount in California's history—and more about our most destructive state fires.

The cost of fire suppression talks to how much it costs to fight wildfires. <u>Cal Fire</u> routinely spends more money than is budgeted to defeat wildfires, and in 2020, fire suppression costs skyrocketed to more than \$1 billion for the first time. Visitor users of the dashboard can find out how much Cal Fire's emergency fund has been since 1979 while reading more about the new

technology and analytics being used to fight today's wildfires.

The impact on firefighters shows us that firefighters not only risk their lives in every fire they fight, but they also face significant PTSD and suicidal thoughts after battling huge blazes. In fact, mental anguish is so prevalent today that firefighters are more likely to die of suicide than in the line of duty—a truly sobering thought to be sure. This part of the dashboard also presents how rates of suicide, grief, and substance abuse have increased among firefighters over time. Lastly, the dashboard lets the reader spend some time with the award-winning "Trial by Fire" series by CalMatters' Julie Cart.

The wildfire dashboard is a follow-up to CalMatters' water and drought tracker to keep up with another consequence of climate change.

Our Dollar Point Community service provider, Liberty, uses natural gas and petroleum products, solvents, and other chemicals in their operations.
