

Most likely, our swim float will not be in the water again this year, and some first row buoys may not be useable all season. We urge all homeowners and their families to be extremely careful in the water and around the pier again this summer.

Our landscape contractor, Peak Landscape, has been busy doing the necessary spring cleanup and landscaping enhancements to keep our recreation areas looking beautiful. Special thanks go out to Sky Richardson, who volunteers his time and expertise in working with Peak.

While this winter's much anticipated El Nino produced only average snowfall, it was enough to push Tahoe's level over the natural rim for the first time since mid-October 2014. The water depth at the Dollar Point pier currently stands at just above five feet and it is estimated with the snow runoff, the lake level will top out at about one to one and one half feet above the natural rim. As a result, we are starting out this summer season in much better shape than we started out last year and we hope to be able to use all the buoys in the buoy field all season. That's the good news. The bad news is, this year we had more requests for buoys than any previous season. As always, Debbie did her very best to accommodate everyone but we still have a wait-

ing list of 30+. If you have rented a buoy and have any availability at all for a week or more of non-use, please let Debbie know. The paddleboard racks and kayak racks are also filled to capacity. A special thanks to Debbie for doing her very best to accommodate as many boaters, kayakers and paddle borders as possible.

We have added additional beach umbrellas and now have a total of 12. Additionally we will be significantly increasing the number of lounges and chairs at the beach. Jesse and his staff are busy readying the beach facilities and we should be ready to go by Memorial Day weekend. Please remember to treat all of our staff members with respect and courtesy.
