The snow is melting, the lake is full, and summer is on its way. The Board and staff are getting ready for another great Dollar Point summer. Here's what's happening:

Staffing: There are big changes. As announced, Debbie Wolf is retiring and will be leaving us in early June. Debbie has done so much for our Association and we are very grateful for her time here. Debbie left "big shoes to fill" and the personnel committee and board were challenged to find a replacement for her. However, through an extensive search, Sara Barnes has been hired to replace Debbie as the Association Manager. Sara has been in North Lake Tahoe for 6 years and her background in Human Resources at our local ski resorts and dealing with the challenges of a seasonal recreational workforce make her the perfect person to take over for Debbie. In addition, Amy Ellis has been hired as the new Recreation Manager. Amy is highly qualified and comes to Dollar Point with over 15 years of aquatic and recreation experience, most recently at Tahoe Donner. To assist Amy, we are pleased to welcome back Ashley Lucas as the Assistant Recreation Manager. Additionally, Sara and Amy have committed to elevating the experience for our homeowners and their guests as well as the service standards of our staff at the pool, beach and pier. All of our 2017 summer staff positions have been filled and we are ready to go!

A special thanks to the personnel committee, Pat Tweedy and Mitch Packard, for all the time and effort they put in to finding Debbie's replacement.

Landscaping: The heavy snow storms this winter have done a significant amount of damage to the trees and plants throughout Dollar Point. There is still a lot of snow to melt, especially in the pool area. Peak Landscape has started cleaning up where they can but until the snow has completely melted we won't know the full extent of the work/expense required to get things back in order. the pool, the cover is still on, and while we do not anticipate any "surprises" we cannot be sure until the cover is removed. We remain *cautiously optimistic* that with warmer weather and the cooperation of Mother Nature, the pool will be open by Memorial Day.

As customary, we will be having our annual "dumpster day" on Monday, May 29th with an added supplemental "dumpster day" date of Saturday, June 24th to allow additional time for snow to melt. Please remember the dumpsters are for yard waste only and nothing other than yard waste will be accepted.

Beach and pier and TRPA issues: Of course, the big, big news is that the lake is full and should stay that way until well into the summer! The other big news at the beach is that TRPA has agreed to again let us use the kayak and paddle board racks. However, we will have to go through the permitting process as required by TRPA. Jan Brisco, our consultant for TRPA issues, is assisting us with this as well as our request to add additional racking. In addition, due to the discovery of a yellow cress plant on our beach last summer (now under feet of water), TRPA will no longer allow us to rake the beach. Since we consider beach raking an important beach safety issue, we are working with TRPA on this but we will not know if raking can resume until mid-May. Otherwise, other than general maintenance, at this time there are no significant projects being undertaken at the beach/pier.

I would like to offer a word of thanks to my fellow board members: Mitch Packard, Debbie Nicholson, Pete Newell, Pat Tweedy, Pat Cala and Carol Wilmar. It has been a challenging year and the time and energy invested by all is greatly appreciated. Finally, one last thanks, good bye and good luck to Debbie. Your service and dedication have been greatly appreciated. You will be missed.

Other than general maintenance, there are no significant projects planned for the beach/pier this summer. However, the maintenance and clean up needed is substantial. Included in the in the maintenance projects are the repair of the buoy boat and the painting and renumbering of the buoys. With the lake level up we are able, for the first time in many years, to put the swim platform in the water. In the past we have allowed vehicles to drive on the beach to access the kayak racks. We have been informed by TRPA, motor vehicles are strictly forbidden on the Dollar Point beach. Please observe and obey this rule.

Requests for kayak/paddle board storage and buoys were at an all-time high this year. Unfortunately, we were unable to accommodate a significant number of kayak/paddle requests and there are 19 members on the waiting list for buoys. Please, if your circumstances change and you do not need or use the racks, or you have time when you are not going to use you buoy, please let the Dollar Point management office know. Even just a few days could be very helpful.

We expect this to be a very busy season and with the lake full, activity around the pier is going to be intense. While diving from the pier is not permitted, it happens, and this year the temptation to jump will be great! With deep water, jumping or diving from the pier is not the issue as much as the mix of motor boats and swimmers. I personally have been involved in "close calls" with jumpers and swimmers completely oblivious to the fact there boats motoring at the pier. Our staff is there to ensure the safety of all those using the beach and pier so please follow their instructions. Whether on the beach, pier, pool, or other Dollar Point facility, we insist our staff be treated with respect at all times. Thank you for cooperating.

### Concerned about Defensible Space? Join us!

You all know by now that we had a whale of a winter. Dollar Point got all the snow we prayed for, and a lot more! Hard winters bring new growth, and leave us with yards in need of serious clean up. We hope to see many of you over Memorial Dumpster Day cleaning up your yards in preparation for what should be a great summer.

Yards and roofs should be clear of pinecones and needles, manzanita should be cut back, and trees should be trimmed to 10 feet away from the house. In addition, many Dollar Point homes do not have visible house numbers due to hanging foliage. The fire department responds to address numbers. If these can't be seen, help can be delayed. This is an easy and cheap fix, so please check your house numbers from the street when you get back to town.
